SABBATICAL – What is it?

Sabbatical... What does this word mean to you? For many people, this word has little connection to the Bible or our faith community. Instead people think of academics and professors who take time off from their regular teaching to do some research or write a book, or something like that. Many people think a Sabbatical is just an extended vacation and a time to goof off.



In fact, “Sabbatical” is rooted in the word “Sabbath,” the day on which the Creator rested from labor, which literally means, “Stop.” “Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy,” say the Lord our God, in the Third Commandment.

Sabbath/Sabbatical is a time for Rest, Renewal, Re-Creation, and Devotion. It is a time away from the day to day demands of work. It is a time to “fill up the tank” – of mind, heart, body, soul, and relationships.

A Sabbatical is part of the Call of a Pastor in the ELCA, to be taken once every seven years, if possible. So, after ten years of serving Christus Victor, Pastor Kent will be taking a Sabbatical starting in late May of 2009. In the coming months Pastor Kent will be sharing with the church his plans and the focus of his Sabbatical time, which will be “Passing on the Faith.” He will also need the support, prayers, and participation of members of Christus Victor to make this Sabbatical a time for mutual learning and growth. For I was Hungry and You Fed Me

Join Social Ministries **Saturday October 11th** as we team up with **Feed My Starving Children** to package meals for people in grave need. We will be packaging meals at **Feed My Starving Children's** Eagan location from 9am -11am. We are in need of volunteers for this service project as well as donations to help cover the cost of the food we package.

Feed My Starving Children has recently focused on providing meals for the hurricane and flood devastated country of Haiti. The situation in Haiti was already bleak before this year's hurricane season began. Haiti has an 80% poverty rate, and at least 33% of the children under the age of 5 are malnourished. Haitians desperate for something affordable to eat have resorted to making and eating "mud cookies" to quell their hunger. "Mud cookies" consist of dirt, salt and vegetable shortening. Although obviously nutritionally inferior to the typical staples of rice and beans, mud cookies are the only "food" many Haitians can afford to feed their families due to the soaring cost of rice and other traditional foods.

It only takes 17 cents to provide one high-protein, nutritious meal through the **Feed My Starving Children** program. That means each bag of six meals we package costs roughly \$1.00. Considering the fact that the cost of the 2,000 pound bags of rice, for the meals has nearly doubled in price from \$370 to \$700 this past year, \$1.00 for six nutritious meals is a bargain next to the questionable value of a mud cookie.

Please join us on **October 11th** for a morning of fun and fellowship dedicated to reaching out to others in desperate need. We will meet at church at 8:30am and carpool to **Feed My Starving Children**. We are looking for 40 volunteers; you can find information and the sign-up sheet on the Welcome desk in the Narthex. We also greatly appreciate any monetary donations you can contribute. We are hoping to be able to cover the cost of a bag of rice, which would provide 21,600 meals. Make your check payable to Christus Victor, with a note stating Feed My Starving Children in the memo section, and place it in the offering basket during church services. Thanks so much for your support!

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 values, experiences, and qualities that help kids succeed. "Integrity" is one of six positive-values assets.

Acting on Beliefs Means Taking Risks

Fifteen-year-old Ellen Bigger of Key Largo, Florida, had every reason to have strong beliefs—and not act on them.

At the age of 5, she and a group of her kindergarten classmates got caught in cross fire between a sniper high on drugs and a police SWAT team. At age 10, someone high on drugs killed her Girl Scout leader. Ellen quickly learned that drugs were harmful. She could have lived in fear and cynicism as many of the people in her community did.

But Ellen didn't want to live like that. She wanted to live what she believed—that she could make a difference. So she started a program called "Drug-Free Homes." She printed up a brochure explaining the program and telling the danger of drugs. On the back of the brochure, she printed a pledge



for people to sign. She then started asking people to sign up. When they did, she gave them a sticker to place on their front door or window that said: "This Is a Drug-Free Home. Every Member within Has Signed a Pledge to Live a Drug-Free Life."

Not only is Ellen an example of integrity, so is the impact of her program. "If people in the community see that even one family has a sticker up, they have the courage to sign the pledge and post a sticker on their own homes," she says. While it may sometimes be hard for young people to stand up for their convictions, Ellen Bigger shows what can happen when young people act on what they believe.

Admit It

Tell your child about a time when you stood up for something even though it was difficult to do. Explain how you felt. Then share a time when you didn't stand up for something because you were afraid. Discuss why it's easier to act on your convictions in some situations than others.

time together

Three ways to help your child build integrity:

1. Learn to talk to your child about difficult issues such as domestic violence, oppression, and prejudice. Help your child understand how these issues relate to her or his integrity.
2. Celebrate when your child acts on a belief or conviction when it was obviously difficult to do. Standing up for a belief may convince others to believe in it, too.
3. Share with your child the times when you feel tempted to ignore your values and beliefs.

Quick Tip:
Integrity builds over a lifetime.

3 Steps of Integrity

“One cannot have integrity without also displaying a measure of honesty,” says Stephen L. Carter in his book *Integrity*. Yet, he contends that integrity is more difficult than just being honest. Carter’s three steps of integrity are:

1. Take time to discern right from wrong. What do you believe? What do you value?
2. Get involved in what you believe and value. Do something about it.
3. Admit publicly what you believe and value while acting on what you say.

talk together

Questions to discuss with your child:

- What does integrity mean to our family?
- When is it easy to act on your beliefs? When is it difficult? Why?
- What happened the last time you stood up for or spoke out about what you value?
